MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 13TH AUGUST 2014

It was proposed by Cllr Harris and seconded by Cllr Webb that the minutes were a true and accurate record. Cllr Mrs Land abstained as she had not attended the meeting on 13th August. The remainder of the Parish Council was all in favour.

R-WAY REPORT

As Jasmin Tresadern was on holiday Jai Cunningham had emailed a report on the activities of the group.

Summer Scheme: In all, 20 different young people took part in activities over the summer with the average group size daily, across the project, being 11. The final week (week 3) of the holiday activities went well and the Summer Scheme culminated in a family friendly circus and BBQ on Monday that was enjoyed by all.

Week 3 gave young people the chance to look at: Sports, Health and Fitness – where the young people trialled some new games and challenged themselves to achieve their own personal best scores in Circuit Training; Circus skills – along with a circus instructor, young people were invited to try different things in small workshops like juggling, devil sticks, diabolo, acrobatics and plate spinning; Drama – young people worked together and in small groups to play drama games that allowed them to have a taste of working with people they don't usually, performing in front of others, using their imagination to create their own sketches and working with props.

Monday 8th September: 'End of Summer BBQ': 'Jake the Juggler' returned and helped young people for 2 hours, along with Mark and Jai in preparing various acts to perform to parents after the session. Johnno and Chris took care of the BBQ and Saraan from the Old George provided Burgers, Buns, Sausages and Sauce which was greatly appreciated! Unfortunately Jasmin was on holiday but we have a video of the young people's performance (which went on for 20mins!) to show her. Parents arrived at 6:00pm and 16 young people took part in total, 4 of which had not done the circus skills at the summer workshop session.

Notices: Chris has returned now and is more able to support the group as he has done his best to get Monday's off work. Great to have Chris back; Johnno has offered to give further support group on a regular basis. Thank you!; Emily and Mark have shown great commitment as volunteers. It would be great to get them trained up like Jas and Chris were; Jai is looking forward to sharing the responsibilities with the above Team and Jasmin, (yes it is feeling like a team again!) and hopefully we will get better be able to the needs of our young people; Seniors on the back burner a little until the Team has had some more time to put together an action plan; Junior sessions will now be 4:30-6:00pm to accommodate those who have gone up to senior school and can't return in time; We are looking in to widening support and communication with parents; Swimming at the Hoburne next Monday! Funds go to Oak and Furrows.

REPORT ON THE MEETING OF THE PLAYING FIELDS AND VILLAGE MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE HELD ON MONDAY 8TH SEPTEMBER

Cllr Mrs Chapman, Cllr Mrs Chubb, Cllr Harris, Cllr Kimberley, Cllr Mrs Land, Cllr Nicholas and Cllr Mrs Tunbridge attended the meeting. Cllr Harris opened the meeting at 7pm.

Apology

Cllr Stuart had sent an apology for absence as he was on vacation.

Matters Arising from previous Minutes**Flooding**

Cllr Harris reported that the Environment Agency would be removing gravel upstream of the road bridge but was unsure of the exact location. Ben Wellbourn of Cotswold Water Park Trust will treat the Japanese knotweed before the gravel is removed.

Cllr Harris had arranged a meeting with Peter Collins of the Environment Agency on 28th August but a family emergency had necessitated a postponement. Cllr Harris has, without success, tried to reconvene a meeting with Mr Collins.

Cllr Harris had liaised with Mark Goldby of Bromford Housing hoping to resolve the sand bag barrier issue in Box Bush.

Cllr Harris enquired from the Clerk if there had been any development on the supply of stickers to attach to dog bins. The Clerk was unable to confirm but advised that the question should be put to Cllr Ms J. Layton (CDC).

Ham Lane/Sudeley Drive ramp (pages 3357, 3378, 3385, 3398)

Cllr Harris decided to leave discussion on this item until the October meeting.

Ground Maintenance (pages 3357, 3378, 3385, 3398)

Cllr Mrs Chapman complained that the churchyard in Cerney Wick had not been cut. Cllr Mrs Tunbridge complained about the quality of the cut in the churchyard in South Cerney. The Clerk was requested to enquire from Andrew Woodman about his work schedule: 1. When was the last time that the churchyard in Cerney Wick was attended to? 2. When will the play area in Cerney Wick be cut? Certainly it will need to be done before the end of the season; 3. When was the last time that the churchyard in South Cerney was attended to?

Mr Woodman had answered the queries in an email about the ground maintenance work he had stated he had carried out. Cllr Mrs Chapman and Cllr Mrs Tunbridge were sceptical with his response.

Upper Up Car Park specification (pages 3357, 3379, 3386, 3399)

Of the 8 specifications which had been sent out to contractors to quote for the work only one had replied so far. Cllr Harris decided to leave discussion on this item until the October meeting.

Berkeley Close cardboard recycling (page 3380, 3386)

Cllr Harris enquired if there had been any further development on the removal of the recycling bins in Berkeley Close. The situation remained as before. Scott Williams, Strategic Client Officer, Joint Waste Team had emailed that before the bins are moved the team is in the process of undertaking a full review of the Council's bring recycling sites and will take on board the request from the PC in our final recommendations. This initiative is hoping to allow the District Council to tailor the recycling facilities requested by local residents which aren't offered by way of the kerbside collections, with the recycling banks that are available in the community, and is intended to try and divert more waste from landfill and maximise recycling performance which I'm sure you will support. Once the review has been completed we will be contacting you again to explore what potential other options are available instead of permanent removal, which will hopefully support our aspiration of greater recycling within the community.

Picnic Tables at Cerney Wick and Robert Franklin Way play areas (3387, 3399)

Bob Berry had advised that the weight of the furniture would not stop those determined to remove the equipment and the benches should be anchored securely. Mr Berry had quoted

£350 for the complete installation with secure anchor points. The Committee recommended that the Finance Committee accepts this proposal.

Ham Lane surface upgrade (page 3400)

The Committee accepted a specification that Cllr Harris had prepared for contractors to base their quotation. The Clerk will send it out to appropriate suppliers including Tonic the groundwork contractors working for Redrow Homes at the Mallards.

Hedges on western side of Ham Lane (page 3400)

Although committee members acknowledged that it was not the responsibility of the Parish Council to maintain the hedge on the western side of Ham Lane it would be necessary for the hedge to be cut back to enable contractors to use equipment to upgrade the surface of Ham Lane. Redrow Homes had partly cut back the hedge on the eastern side and house owners on the western side would be responsible for hedges on their property overgrowing the lane. Nevertheless, if the path is to be upgraded then the hedge will have to be cut back. A tender specification will be sent to suitable contractors and the situation reassessed when costs are known.

Saplings on wetlands at Upper Up

Cllr Harris apologised for not preparing a specification for the removal of the saplings.

INSPECTION REPORTS

Cerney Wick

Cllr Mrs Chapman reported that the play area was in good order and getting plenty of use, albeit mostly from children outside the Cerney Wick settlement area. Cllr Mrs Chapman noted that the grass on the play area would need a good trim before the onset of winter.

Robert Franklin Way

Cllr Mrs Chubb and Cllr Mrs Tunbridge had carried out the weekly inspections at Robert Franklin Way play area.

Upper Up

Cllr Stuart had carried out the inspections. Two of the seats on the Senior Swings had been vandalised with considerable damage to one seat. The Clerk will ask Bob Berry to quote to replace both seats. The Cycle Mounds had been cut and were quite tidy. The entrance to the car park was very uneven again and likely to cause damage to car sumps. The laying of aggregate is not an effective solution.

APPOINTMENT OF A PLAY AREA AND PLAY EQUIPMENT INSPECTOR

Cllr Kimberley requested that all committee members check the basis of the play inspectors quotations for comparison. A decision can then be taken at next month's meeting. The Clerk will forward details of suppliers and their various methods of pricing to committee members. At the Parish Council, Cllr Kimberley asked the Clerk to prepare a schedule of play areas and associated equipment for each selected inspector to assess for cost, instead of analysing each inspector's different pricing structure.

RE-COLOUR OF LETTERING ON WAR MEMORIAL

After a discussion and bearing in mind that the cost of moving the War Memorial had been almost zero the Committee was unanimous in that it was minded to fully support the cost of painting in the letters. Centreline had quoted £827 for the work. Tony Squire had volunteered to collect donations and depending on his success Cllr Stuart would be asked to liaise with him on the amount that the Parish Council would donate. The Committee recommended that the Finance Committee accepts this proposal.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE FARMING AND WILDLIFE ADVISORY GROUP (FWAG) TO CLEAR DITCHES ON THE UPPER UP MEADOWS

The Committee unanimously recommended that the Finance Committee agrees to grant FWAG £500 for its project at Upper Up.

CONSIDER A REQUEST TO THE GCC PROW TEAM FOR A CREATION ORDER UNDER s26 OF THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 TO INSTALL A RAMP TO CONNECT HAM LANE WITH SUDELEY DRIVE

It was proposed by Cllr Nicholas and seconded by Cllr Harris that the committee recommends that the Parish Council agrees with the process of installing a ramp to connect Ham Lane with Sudeley Drive through a Creation Order under S26 of the Highways Act 1980. The Committee was unanimous in its agreement.
